### **Xavier Bettel**

*Prime Minister*

*Minister of State*

Xavier Bettel was born on 3 March 1973 in Luxembourg City.

### **Education and qualifications**

Following secondary school studies, Xavier Bettel pursued higher education studies at the University of Nancy, where he was awarded a master's degree in public and European law from the Faculty of Law, followed by a DEA (post-graduate diploma of advanced studies) in political sciences and public law.

### **Governmental posts**

Following the legislative elections of 20 October 2013, Xavier Bettel was appointed Prime Minister, Minister of State, Minister for Communications and Media, Minister for Religious Affairs on 4 December 2013 in the coalition government formed by the Democratic Party (DP), the Luxembourg Socialist Workers' Party (LSAP) and the Green Party ("déli gréng").

### **Other political posts**

A member of the DP since 1989, Xavier Bettel was elected to Parliament for the first time in 1999 at the age of 26 while standing for the DP in the constituency of the Centre. He was re-elected in 2004, 2009 and 2013. In Parliament, he assumed among others the roles of vice-chairman of the Legal Affairs Committee from 2004 to 2013 and vice-chairman of the Committee of Enquiry into the State Intelligence Service from 2012 to 2013. From 2009 to 2011, he assumed the role of chairman of the DP parliamentary group.

At local level, Xavier Bettel initially served as a municipal councillor of the City of Luxembourg from 2000 to 2005, then as an alderman from 2005 to 2011. Following the municipal elections of 2011, he assumed the role of mayor, an office he held until his appointment as Prime Minister, Minister of State in December 2013.

Since January 2013, Xavier Bettel has been the chairman of the DP.

### **Professional activities**

From 2001 to 2013, Xavier Bettel worked as a barrister in Luxembourg.

He is also a Senior Advisor to The Chertoff Group, a premier security and risk management advisory firm, and a Member of the Experts Group of the Risk Assistance Network + Exchange (RANE).



## **Merit E. Janow**

***Dean, School of International and Public Affairs, Columbia University***

Merit E. Janow is an internationally recognized expert in international trade and investment, with extensive experience in academia, government, international organizations and business. She is Dean of the faculty of the School of International and Public Affairs (SIPA) and a Professor of Practice in International Economic Law and International Affairs at SIPA and affiliated faculty at Columbia Law School. In addition, she is Co-Director of the APEC Study Center and until recently Chair of the Faculty Oversight Committee of Columbia's Global Center East Asia. In December, 2003 Professor Janow was elected for a four year term as one of the seven Members of the World Trade Organization's (WTO) Appellate Body – the first female to serve on the Appellate body. From 1997 to 2000, she served as the Executive Director of the first international antitrust advisory committee of the U.S. Department of Justice. Prior to joining Columbia's faculty, she was Deputy Assistant U.S. Trade Representative for Japan and China (1989-93). Professor Janow is on the Board of Directors of several corporations in financial services and technologies, and serves on the board of several not for profit organizations. In 2009, she became a charter member of the International Advisory Council of China's sovereign wealth fund, China Investment Corporation or CIC. She grew up in Japan and speaks Japanese. She has a JD, Columbia Law School and a BA in Asian Studies, University of Michigan.

He worked as a legal clerk at the European Court of Justice before joining the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 1999. His assignments focused on the successive EU Treaty negotiations (Amsterdam, Nice, Constitution, Lisbon).

Nicolas was consecutively posted at Luxembourg's Permanent Representation to the EU (2002-07), as Deputy Chief of Mission at Luxembourg's Embassy in Washington, DC (2007-11) and as Consul General in Shanghai (2011-13) where he was in charge of promoting Luxembourg's economic interests throughout China as the Executive Director of the Luxembourg Trade and Investment Office.



## **Kenneth A. Minihan**

### ***Lt. Gen. USAF (Ret.), Managing Director, Paladin Capital Group***

Lt. General Minihan is a Managing Director and is focused on the development and implementation of new investment opportunities for Paladin's investment funds. Prior to joining Paladin, Lt. General Minihan was the 14th Director of the National Security Agency/Central Security Service. During his military service at the national level, Lt. General Minihan demonstrated a long history of making new technologies operational and implementing leading edge services and products in a competitive environment where lives were often at risk. He has a history of exceeding expectations for performance and timeliness. During the last twenty years of the Cold War and the transition to the Information Age, he was instrumental in the definition and selection of technology solutions to solve the most difficult national security information needs. Throughout that time, Lt. General Minihan helped set the performance standards for information enterprise operations. Lt. General Minihan is the Chairman and President of the Security Affairs Support Association, which focuses on shared government and industry national intelligence and technology challenges. He also is a member of the Air Force Association, the National Military Intelligence Association and other national organizations. He has substantial experience in capital raising, enterprise operations, business development and business readiness assurance. While at the National Security Agency, he was instrumental in the definition and implementation of the National Information Assurance Program. He devotes considerable attention to and consults on national security affairs. Lt. General Minihan has a B.A. Degree from Florida State University, a M.A. Degree from the Naval Postgraduate School, and has completed executive development programs at the University of Illinois and Harvard University. Among his awards and decorations are the National Security Medal, the Defense Distinguished Service Medal, the Bronze Star, the National Intelligence Distinguished Service Medal, and the Legion of Merit.
